Briars in the Cotton Patch explores the unknown story of Koinonia Farm, which may have been the most daring social experiment in the South during the last century. Started in 1942, blacks and whites lived together on the Georgia farm, broke bread at the same table and got paid the same wages. The community became the target of white anger — with bombs, boycotts and shootings. Out of this violent history grew the worldwide movement of Habitat for Humanity International.
